## Facilities

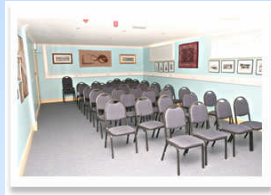
### Refreshments

# Killybegs Maritime & Heritage Centre



## Introduction

The Killybegs Maritime & Heritage Centre offers an unique experience for visitors who venture to this picturesque town situated on the Donegal Bay.

## Killybegs Carpet Factory



The looms here are original to the carpet factory and date back to 1898. The longest hand-knotting loom in the world may be seen here at the Killybegs Heritage Centre. It's made of Canadian pitch pine and is one solid piece of timber, weighting four tons.

### Did you know?

- The longest hand-knotting loom in the world weighs 4 tons and is 42 ft wide.
- It was a Scottish businessman who set up the Donegal Carpets in 1898 - Alexander Morton
- The first carpet was made in Killybegs in 1901.
- Donegal Carpets cover the floors in Aras an Uachtarain, Dublin.

## Fishing Industry



Enjoy a fascinating insight into the history of one of the largest fishing fleets in Ireland, and take a journey into the past by listening to the experiences of some of the Killybegs fishermen who give their own personal account of life in bygone days.

### Did you know?

- The first training academy to train fishermen in the art of net making, boat building, seamanship and fishing was set up 1891.
- The first boat was built in Killybegs in 1899
- There were 28 boats centred at Killybegs in 1963
- From that time Killybegs grew to be the largest fishing port in Ireland
- The Atlantic Dawn was the largest fishing trawler ever to join the Irish fleet.

On display in the Centre there is a history in photographs of this industry and the people who helped shape it in Killybegs.



## Visual & Inter-Active Displays

### History of Ulster

Wall displays highlighting the history of the Ulster area, with particular interest in the plantation of Ulster and the Flight of the Earls.

### Donegal Carpets

On display are original patterns, orders and invoices, a demonstration of how the knots are made and how the looms work.



The setting up and development of the Donegal Carpets industry, including a demonstration of hand-knotting which made the Donegal Carpets world famous. A hands-on demonstration on the looms still in use, one of which is the longest in the world.

### Bridge Simulator

A family-friendly interactive wheelhouse, *the first of its kind in Ireland*. Discover the art of navigation and communication at sea; experience sights and sounds of a vessel in operation, and test your skills at steering a ship into Killybegs port.



The Simulator provides educational benefits for students and school groups to help focus and extend their learning; creates an awareness of maritime heritage and is a learning tool for navigational technology.
